# **Municipal Plans**

There are a number of plans that we are currently working on that have been required by the Provincial Government. These include

- Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP). This is an agreement between the County of Athabasca, the Summer Village of Island Lake South and the Summer Village of Island Lake. This plan addresses plans for the areas important to all concerned parties. We have a rough draft in place and information has been included with this newsletter regarding the open house at which this will be presented to residents. The information can also be found on our website on the Public Participation page.
- Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF). This is an agreement between the County of Athabasca and the Summer Village of Island Lake South. It will address any formal agreements for service between the two municipalities. This agreement has now been completed.
- Municipal Development Plan (MDP). This is a plan for the future development of our summer villages, roughly estimated over the next 10 years. You will find a rough draft on our website on the public participation page. Please review the draft and provide feedback to bancroftkim@hotmail.com prior to March 10, 2021. Should you need a copy mailed to you, you can also request that at bancroftkim@hotmail.com. We will be holding a public hearing for the MDP on March 10, 2021 at 7:00 pm. This will be an opportunity for anyone who has any comments regarding the MDP to voice them prior to us passing the plan at the end of March. - Land Use Bylaw (LUB). We will be updating our LUB to coordinate with the plans mentioned above. A rough draft will be posted on our website for review within the next month.

# **Election**

This year is an election year. After many years on council, Mayor Jim Sandmaier will be retiring from council this year. We thank him for his years of service and wish him all the best. This means we will need at least one new candidate for election. Nomination forms will need to be turned in June. # **Council Reports**

For 2 years in a row at our general meetings residents voiced their concerns about the number of non-resident boaters that were utilizing our lake. Their concern was for the health of our lake and asked council to take away some of the parking available to non-resident boaters. They asked that only residents be allowed to park in the fenced off area. Our lawyers explained to council that if parking is offered it must be open to residents and non-residents alike. Council fenced off the large area that in time we plan to turn into a park. With Covid the pressure on the lake by non-residents was higher than anyone would have imagined and made the transition to the smaller parking area challenging but as the summer moved on things smoothed out. Council wants to thank our residents for their patience during this transition.

The Island Lake South Recreation Club has been working over the past year trying to secure a Provincial grant that would allow for the building of a new Skating rink and Multi-use playing surface. The playing surface will be used for activities such as pickle ball, basketball and other activities. While waiting for the grant to be approved, the Island Lake South Rec club and volunteers from the area have built a temporary skating surface at the old rink location to be used by the community. The maintenance of this ice rink will be done solely by volunteer time.. Please feel free to reach out if you would like to volunteer some time this winter. This temporary rink will provide the community a place to skate during the day and evenings. The lights will be on in the evenings and the warm-up shack will also be open for use. Please follow the COVID guidelines posted at the warm-up shack when using the facility. Thank you to Cheap Seats Sporting Goods in Athabasca for donating new nets for the skating rink!

The Island Lake Rec Club is hopeful that the new rink and playing surface will be approved and built in spring/summer 2021. There has been lots of outreach by residents in all surrounding communities to assist with the grant application and any volunteer work getting a new rink and playing surface built.
