

SUMMER VILLAGE OF ISLAND LAKE SOUTH

IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

BY-LAW NO. 26/88

PURPOSE:

A By-Law of the Summer Village of Island Lake South in the Province of Alberta for the purpose of entering into an Agreement with the Summer Village of Island Lake, the Summer Village of Whispering Hills, the Summer Village of South Baptiste, the Summer Village of West Baptiste, the Summer Village of White Gull, the Summer Village of Sunset Beach and the County of Athabasca #12.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980, Chapter M-26 and amendments thereto Section 113, a Municipality may enter into an agreement with other Municipalities for a common purpose;

AND WHEREAS, the Council of the Summer Village of Island Lake South deems it expedient and in its best interest to enter into such an agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Summer Village of Island Lake South Duly Assembled Enacts As Follows:

1. THAT the Summer Village of Island Lake South enter into an agreement with the Municipalities of the Summer Village of Island Lake, the Summer Village of Whispering Hills, the Summer Village of South Baptiste, the Summer Village of West Baptiste, the Summer Village of White Gull, the Summer Village of Sunset Beach and the County of Athabasca #12 for the purpose of obtaining and operating a Sewage Lagoon on the SE 23-67-24-W4.
2. THAT a committee comprising one member of the Council of each Municipality be formed and that this committee be known as the "Baptiste-Island Lake Sewage Lagoon Committee".
3. THAT each participating municipality have one vote on the committee.
4. THAT the County of Athabasca #12 act as sole banking agent and administrative centre with the County member to be Chairman and the County Manager to be Secretary/Treasurer.
5. THAT all funds for operation of the committee, and construction of the Sewage Lagoon be handled by the County of Athabasca and that separate accounting records be kept for this purpose.
6. THAT the committee be responsible for construction, control, and managing of the Sewage Lagoon.
7. THAT funding for the construction, maintenance and operation of the Sewage Lagoon be by formula agreed upon by all participating Councils as per attached Schedule "A".
- 7a. THAT all abuses related to illegal dumping of sewage shall be reported to the Public Health Inspector at the Athabasca Health Unit.
8. THAT the committee be authorized to disburse funds for the purpose of the Sewage Lagoon within the guidelines as established by the participating Municipalities and to requisition on the formula, as set out in Schedule "A" attached.
9. THAT an audited financial statement be provided to each Municipality upon completion of the project.

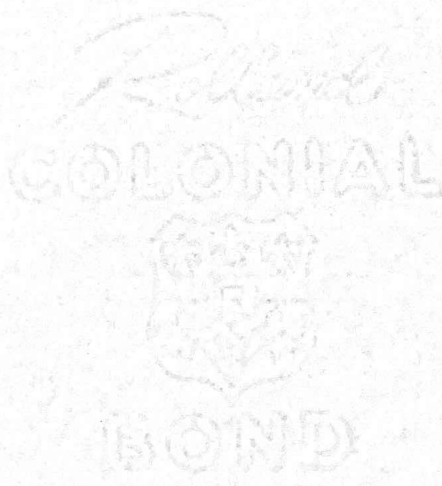
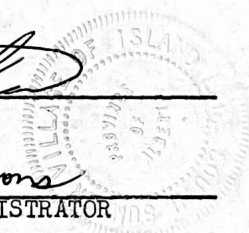

SCHEDULE "A"

TO BYLAW NUMBER 26/88

The formula for funding the construction of the Baptiste/Island Lake Sewage Lagoon between the County of Athabasca No. 12, the Summer Village of Island Lake, the Summer Village of Island Lake South, the Summer Village of Whispering Hills, the Summer Village of West Baptiste, the Summer Village of South Baptiste, the Summer Village of White Gull, and the Summer Village of Sunset Beach shall be established using the following criteria and percentages to determine the share of the unsupported costs to be paid by each municipality:

Summer Village of Island Lake	30%
Summer Village of Island Lake South	8%
Summer Village of Whispering Hills	16%
Summer Village of West Baptiste	12%
Summer Village of South Baptiste	11%
Summer Village of White Gull	8%
Summer Village of Sunset Beach	15%

The County of Athabasca shall be required to obtain all permits, licenses, and permission to operate from various government departments. The County of Athabasca shall also see to the regular maintenance of the facility, with this expense to be borne by the County. "Regular maintenance" shall refer to periodic inspections, grass cutting, weed control, fence repairs, general clean up as required, and access road maintenance.
